2. A brief History of the University

The V.V. John Committee was appointed by Government of Gujarat in April, 1973 to review the status of higher education and establish new universities. Following the recommendations of the committee, the North Gujarat University has been established by North Gujarat University Ordinance (Gujarat Ordinance No.5 of 1986, dated 17-05-1986). The Ordinance was later converted into an Act, passed by Gujarat Legislative Assembly on 29-08-1986 as North Gujarat University Act (No. 22 of 1986, dated 10-09-1986). This University has now been renamed as Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University (by Gujarat Act No. 2 of 2003 dated 01-03-2003), to honour the great philosopher, thinker and Jainacharya Hemchandracharya Suri, who made valuable contribution to the studies in grammer, literature, religion and philosophy.





The jurisdiction of the University cover four districts Viz., Patan, Mehsana, Banaskantha and Sabarkantha and caters to cultural and educational need of this region

There are 16 post graduate departments, two constituent colleges and 07 centers on campus. Number of affiliated colleges has increased to 300 from 41 during year. The University was accredited with "B" (CGPA) grade (2.55) by "NAAC" in 2008. The curricula are well designed and revised regularly to meet with recent developments and professional needs.



The University has beautiful, well planned and lovely campus which is spread over 212 acers of land with facilities of Central library, Computer center, Hostels for Man & Women, Well developed Sport complex, Health center, Canteen, Post office and Bank. The campus life has a blend of rural to urban style, learning with research aptitude and dynamic curricular and co-curricular activities adding more colours to the student's life.

Emblem of the University



The emblem of the University contains a picture of Saraswati framed in a gavaksha or niche. Devi Saraswati, traditionally representing learning, is depicted after a painting in the old prakrit manuscript of Dash-Vaikalik. The design of "Gavanksha" simple and elegant, is adopted from the excavation of " Rani ki Vav" in Patan.

The emblem thus recall the ancient art and culture of Gujarat at the peak of its glory centuries ago, when patan was a great centre of learning.

The motto invokes divine blessings of sacred knowledge. It also relates to the Saraswati, the holy Vedic kumarika river on the bank of which the University is located and which symbolises an endless flow of ever growing knowledge.

3. University Departments at a Glance

3.1 Department of Sanskrit & Bharatiya vidya

Sanskrit and Bharatiya Vidhya Department has been established in 1993-94. Initially Dr. Kanjibhai Patel headed the Department. Dr. Tapasvi Nandi preceded to give the present state of the Department till 2007. Dr. Rathava is shouldering the responsibilities as Head. Dr. D.G. VEDIYA (16-9-1994 to 14-6-1998), Dr. A.M. Prajapati (15-6-1998 to 14-6-2003) have served as leaders of the department. Dr. A.K. Shastri (16-3-2003 to 3-10-2007) 30/10/





2007. Able guidance of these Sanskrit laureates of national repute have made a different tradition in the department. This department has an edge over the normal traditional, adding the vast ancient, Indian knowledge system, which range from Ayurved to Vastu, astrology and languages and scripts of Pali and Prakrit. Department arranges regular classes for NET/SLET and other competitive examination preparation. Every year 1-2 students passé the NET/SLET examination from the department.

3.2 Department of English

Keeping in mind the emphasis laid down by the National Knowledge Commission on disseminating knowledge about Indian culture and tradition and also to learn about other culture the department has introduced, for intensive studies, special courses of a highly interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary and comparative nature. Specialized courses on to check including American, Canadian, Australian, African and Indian Diaspora Studies have been introduced, in addition to skill based papers, with a view to familiarizing the students with the classical as well as the latest trends in world literatures and cultures, and preparing the students for NET/SLET examinations.

3.3 Department of Commerce & Management

The Sevantilal Kantilal School of Business Management (SKSBM) has been established in the Tenth anniversary of the university in 1996 to make the distinct contribution to management education and research. The institute owes its reverence to the Sevantilal Kantilal Trust, Mumbai for its benevolent and generous donation towards the construction of an exclusive building.

The MBA Programme with an intake of 60 students is duly approved By A.I.C.T.E.. Over the past fourteen years of its existence, the school has established itself as a center for excellence in management education. Presently, it runs two years full-time programme in management (MBA), Doctoral programme in Management (Ph.D-Management) and Master of Philosophy programme in commerce (M.Phil-commerce). The department offers specialization in marketing & Finance in its MBA Programme. Department has organized eleven national & state level seminars and workshops. The school has gained a reputation as premier management institute of Gujarat state.

3.4 Department Of Chemistry

The Department of Chemistry of the Hem. North Gujarat University has been established in 1997.





3.5 Department Of Mathematics

Department focus on quality education and innovative research, activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution. 3.6 Department of Life Science (Including Environmental Sc. & Microbiology)

The Department is established in November 1998 to cater the need of this region for higher education in the field of life science. The department has progressive journey with 15 students of Microbiology seating in temporary premises to the current strength of 120 students in different programme within a state of the art premises.

Apart from the primary thrust of academics the department is vigorously involved in research. The department has completed number of research projects funded by state/national and international agencies and have contributed with many research publications to the society of science. The research arena is now developing through international research grants and collaboration mainly in the field of wildlife and conservation biology.

Our students have proved their academic potential with excellent examination results and good employment rate. Moreover, the immigration of many students to overseas for higher education and employment indicates our global acceptance.

3.7 Department Of Hospital Management

With the spending power of patients increased, many corporate are coming up and investing in health care industry. Health care industry is set for rapid growth. Hospitals are expected to deliver quality services 24 hours a day at a reseanoable cost. The urgent nature of its work and the level of efficiency that is expected have increased the need of well trained health professionals and administrators. The Gujarat Government, realizing the need for nurturing future talents to service this vital sector of economy and to improve the quality of healthcare delivery, has supported the to setup the Department of Hospital Management in 2009. The institute, with the objective of adhering to the best standards, has adopted student admission criteria for medical & Para-medical undergraduates through entrance





examination. The torchbearers churned out of institute, aptly christened as 'HOSPITAL ADMINISTRATOR.

3.8 Department of Library & Information Science

The Department aims to equip the students with the advanced professional skills for the management of information knowledge, libraries, and information centers so that they can serve the society through an institution of library and information center or through consultancy of the institutional objectives.

3.9 Department of Computer Science

The Department of computer science of the has been established in 1996. The Department has a cyber café, this has 20 Computers all are connected with 8Mbps broadband and it is free to use for student from 9:00AM to 5:00PM including Sundays & off days. The Department has 13015 No. of Books (Including text books), Magazine (39 Nos.), Journals (10 Nos.), News Papers (12 Nos.), Dictionary (22 Nos.), CD, DVD and Project Reports.

Chapter 4

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 Computers as Infrastructure and Learning Resource

4.1.1. INTRODUCTION:

The Computer Center was established with the help of benevolent donation of Shri Rasiklal Jamnadas Shah family towards the construction of building. The separate and exclusive building of the Computer Center is constructed near the Chemistry Department and next to Management Department having spacious built up area of 725 sq. mtrs at the ground floor. The first floor having online laboratories has been constructed with the help of donation from the late Sankalchand Patel family of the visnagar. The building envisages two laboratory for administrative work.

This Computer center was constructed in 1996. The UGC had sanctioned level -1 computer center in 1996 (letter no f.l.-28/96(comp.), date: 27/12/1996) having grant of Rs. 20 lacks for computer hardware's and 1 lacks per year for software's and books up to five years as well as five technical posts.

In 2001, First Floor of this Computer Centre had been constructed with the help of the benevolent donor Shri Bholabhai Patel. Computer Centre having 05 Computer Laboratory with the Total built up Carpet Area is 2000 Sq. mtrs.

Since August, 2010 Computer center shifted to its new building near Sports Complex. All functions of the computer center are running at new computer center which is now known as Result Center.

This new Computer (Result) center was constructed in 2009-10 from university fund around Rs. 75 lacs. This two floors building has full facility for central assessment and result preparation work. Center has full facility like coordinator office, Giant Computer Labs, Pantry, Dining Room, Conference Room, Clerk Office etc. Its Total built up Carpet Area is 2426 Sq. mtrs.

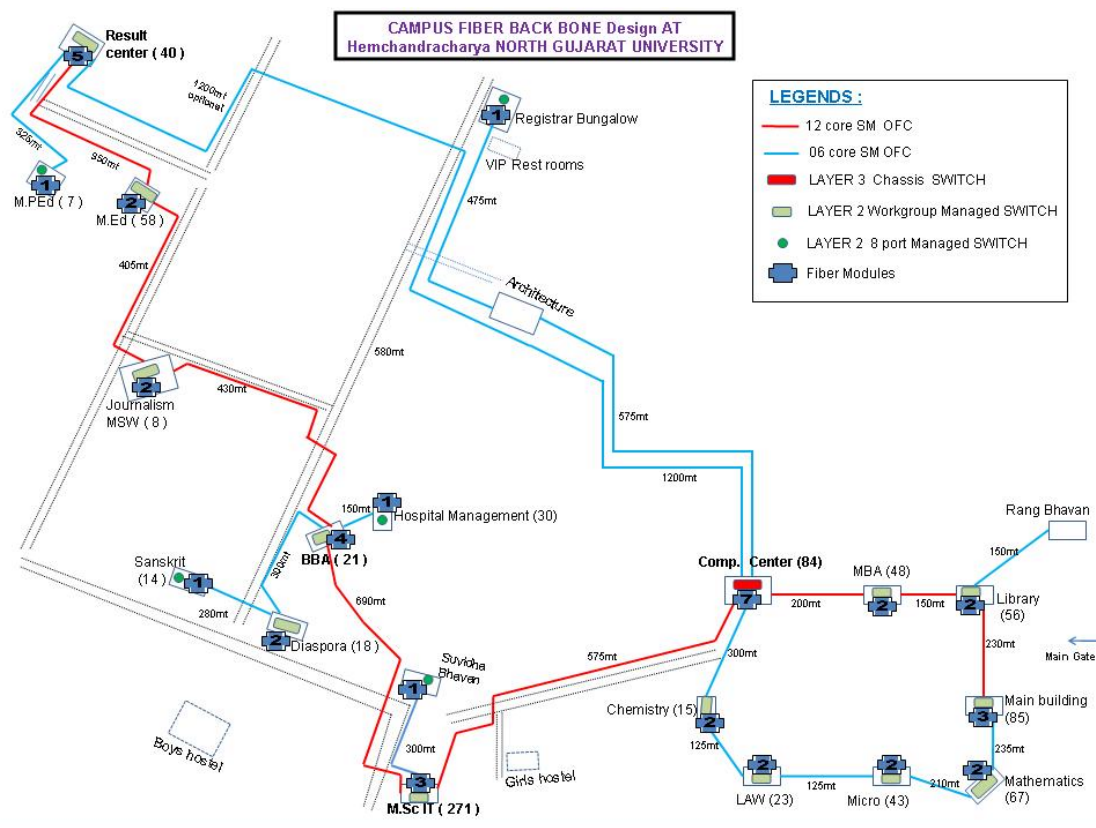


4.1.5. Campus Network :

4.2.5 Library Automation

To keep the Libraries of all Universities and other reputed organization, U.G.C. has established INFLIBNET Centre whose Head Quarter is at the Gujarat University Campus, Ahmedabad.

UGC has provided grant in two installments for purchase of computers and other equipments and accessories for automation of Library. A total of 62,100 book entry has been completed. In addition list of Ph.D, M.Phil. and Master Degree dissertation have also been included in data entry.

Under UGC infonet programme, University Library and various departments have been linked. It has made possible to provide access to all faculty members and researchers Journals on line. A Total of 2000 faculty members students have utilized these services. Student are provided with OPAC and SOUL facilities.

The University has facilitated all faculty and research scholars with online access of research journals.

4.2.6 Library Service

5.4 Extramural Studies

5.7 SC/ST Cell

Implementation of Reservation Policy & Welfare programmes for Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe.

The University strictly follows the provisions of the Circulars/ Guidelines issued from time to time by the Government of India, State Government & University Grants Commission, New Delhi in respect of Reservation Policy & implementation of Welfare Schemes for Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe students.

The reservation in admission to various courses run by the University & affiliated Colleges, hostel facilities, allocation of Staff Quarters and employment is applied as per the prevailing rules & regulations in this regard.

With a view to implement the welfare programmes meant for these weaker sections of the society, the University has formulated an ad-hoc SC-ST cell including therein the SC-ST teachers of the University & Colleges as representatives, and Shri A.R. Makwana, Chief Accounts Officer of the University as Co-ordinator.

During the year under report, a meeting to review the implementation of reservation policy of the Government was held in the University. Shri Rajubhai Parmar, Hon'ble Member, National Commission for Scheduled Caste, New Delhi presided over this Meeting.

As per the provisions of UGC guidelines, Dr. J.D.Damor, Co-ordinator, NSS & I/C Director, of Physical Education was appointed as Liaison Officer of the University to monitor implementation of reservation policy, Welfare programmes & grievances redressal of the SC-ST student & employees.

5.8 Placement Cell

Individual departments have carried placement activities during the year of report. Department the year of Management, Chemistry, Computer Science, Life Sciences have organized campus interview with various industrial units to facilitate their students for job opportunities several students of representative departments have been selected by the industries





Chapter 6

GOVERNANCE AND LEADERSHIP

6.1 Authorities of the University

6.1.1 The University Court

The University Court reviews the broad policies and programmes of the University and suggest measures for the improvement and development of the University, passes resolutions on the annual report accounts of the University and the audit report of such accounts and advise the Chancellor in respect of any matter which may be referred to it for advice.

6.1.2 The Executive Council

The Executive Council is the executive authority of the University which hold, control and administer the property and funds of the University and enter into, vary, carry out and cancel contracts on behalf of the University in the exercise of performance of the powers and duties assigned to it by or under the Act and the Statutes.

6.1.3 The Academic Council

The Academic Council is the Academic body of the University which is responsible for the maintenance and standards of teaching and examination of the university.

6.1.4 The Faculties

The University have faculties of Arts, Education, Science, Technology including Engineering, Law, Medicine, Commerce and Rural Studies and such other faculties may be prescribed by the Statute. Each faculty have the general control and power of regulation of, and is responsible for maintenance of standards of teaching and examinations of the University for the subject comprised in it.

6.1.5 The Board of Studies

The Board of Studies recommend courses of studies in the subject in which the board is concerned and prescribe necessary books for study in the subject.

6.1.6 The Planning Board

The Planning Board shall advice and prepare long-term plans of the University to generate new ideas and programmes and to help the University in Periodical evaluation of its work.

6.1.7 The Finance Committee

The Finance Committee reviews the expenditure incurred by the University and ensure proper utilization of the money by the University according to budget provisions.

6.1.8 The Board of University Teaching and Research

The Board of University Teaching and Research is responsible for maintenance of standards of Post-Graduate teaching and research and also make recommendations





regarding the admission to and evaluation of research degrees.

6.1.9 The Board of Extramural Studies

The Board of Extramural Studies makes necessary arrangements for the extra-mural instructions, outside the regular course and studies for degree and diploma, organizes popular lecture series delivered at the University, Campus Summer School, Social Education course, Social Service project and other similar courses of instructions.

6.1.10 The Board of Hostel Management

The Board of Hostel Management recommends rules for the management of University and College hostels.

6.1.11 The Board of Student Welfare

The Board of Student Welfare advise the Executive Council on medical examination, Physical training, health, hygiene of students and organize the University's Youth Festivals.

6.1.12 The University Board of Sports

The University Board of Sports foster and encourage sport and sportsmanship amongst the students of the University, organize, control manage and supervise sports and tournaments within the Jurisdiction of the University and also undertake and conduct Inter-University Competitions.

6.1.13 The Library Committee

The Library Committee subject to the general control of the Executive Council manage the Library and advise the Executive Council on any matter connected with the Library referred to it by the Executive Council. It also make recommendation to the Executive Council regarding administration of the fund and requirement of the staff of the Library.

6.1.14 The University Building Committee

The University Building Committee is responsible for finalizing the plans and estimates building projects of its own and those approved by the University Grants Commission and ensures completion of the building in accordance with the accepted plans.

6.1.15 The College Development Committee

The College Development Committee ensures the proper planning and integrated development of affiliated colleges and provide the colleges necessary help and guidance in their development. It serve as a link between the University, the University Grant Commission, the State Education Department and the Affiliated Colleges.

6.1.16 The Advisory Committee For NSS

The Advisory Committee For NSS is the apex body as far as implementation of NSS at University level is concerned. The committee consider the financial and establishment proposal as per the administrative and policy directives issued by the government of India and contained in NSS manual.





6.1.17 The Joint Consultative Committee

The Joint Consultative Committee is constituted for the purpose of promoting welfare of member of the non-teaching staff of the University, affiliated colleges and recognised institution as may be deemed necessary by the University.

6.1.18 The Examiners Committee

The Examiners Committee is formed every year for each faculty, for the purpose of join up list for appointments to University examinerships.

6.2 University Finance

6.2.1 The University fund is formed under section-61 of university Act. The income from various sources received for various purpose is deposited in this fund. Expenditure is incurred from this fund for the University Administration, Academic Activities, Exam activities and for other works and the Accounts are kept & maintained by the Accounts Branch.

6.2.2. System of Accounts

It is maintained as non-profit making institution on double entry system on cash basis.

6.2.3 Financial Scenario

This university received the grant of Rs.10,89,65,000/- from the state Government for the year 2011-12. The Particulars of grants are as under :
