

Annual Report on Activities of CASH (01-04-2019 to 31-03-2020)

1. Awareness program on Women hygiene

On July 9, 2019, one day Awareness program on Women hygiene in department of chemistry of our university was arranged by CASH. After welcoming the audience the details about why hygiene is necessary for the women particularly during her monthly menstruations period was explained. Prof. Sangita Sharma also explained how Menstruation and menstrual practices still face many social, cultural, and religious restrictions which are a big barrier in the path of menstrual hygiene management. In many parts of the country especially in rural areas girls are not prepared and aware about menstruation so they face many difficulties and challenges at home, schools, colleges and work places.

Dr. smita Vyas explained that rural areas women have very less or women do not have access to sanitary products or they know very little about the types and method of using them or are unable to afford such products due to high cost. So, they mostly rely on reusable cloth pads which they wash and use again and get infected.

Ms. Lallita S. Gohil from Surat has explained Needs and requirements of the adolescent girls and women are ignored despite the fact that there are major developments in the area of water and sanitation. She explained how students should choose sanitation products. She answered to the queries of girls regarding selecting and choosing relevant products. There were more 98 girl students present in the program





2. Celebration of Women's Self Sufficiency Day

One Day state level Program on “વિદેશમાં પસંદગી સાથે સ્વયં સહાયતા”. was organised in convention centre of HNGU on August 8, 2019. This program was sponsored by Gujarat State Non Resident Gujaratis' Foundation, Gandhinagar & N.R.G. Center, Mehsana, and this program was part of fortnight celebrations which are carried out within period of August 1 to August 14 of every year as the instructions from Govt of Gujarat since 2014.

The program was inaugurated by Dr. Anil Nayak, Honourable Vice Chancellor of HNGU, Patan, in presence of Shri Anand B. Patel, District Collector, Shri A. K. Gupta, Principal Judge family court patan, Dr. Asha Patel, MLA, Unja, Shri Vishal B. Gadvi, secretary , DLSA Patan, Shri Snahel Patel, EC member HNGU, Shri Shailesh Patel, EC member HNGU, Shri Dashrat Patel, Director NRG centre mehsana, Shri P. V. Antani, Gujarat state non resident Gujaratis foundation, Gandhi nagar, Dr. D. M. Patel, Registrar HNGU and Prof. Sangita Sharma, chairperson, CASH. Program started with Prayer of Ma Sarswati, followed by University song.





- Prof. Sangita Sharma, CASH chairperson, welcomed all the guests by words and explained what does self sufficiency mean for a women, why and how women always has to suffer because of insufficient and inaccurate knowledge of rules.
- Dr. Anil Nayak, Honorable Vice Chancellor Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University, Patan, said that it is a common practice in Gujarat for the parents to get their daughter married to Non-Resident Indians for three reasons 1. assuming that such grooms would be economically well off and affluent which will not only enable their daughters to lead a life full of comforts, luxuries arid prosperity 2. but will also provide financial support to their families and new avenues for their siblings in foreign countries.3. They can get name in society and boast for that. But it is prime need and duty of a girl that she should think about her self sufficiency and clear everything about the person with whom she is going to be tied up. For that confidence, education and intention is must. We should protect our girls from such false mongers.
- Shri Anand B. Patel, District Collector gave many examples how many village people got cheated by false information given by many NRI and cheated many girls. Many economically poor families has married their daughters to already married people and

has been used as domestic help in foreign countries. He gave a list of programs explained the role of government in such cases and wanted girls to be educated and aware. Warned the girls not be lured by foreign originals.

- Shri P. V. Antani, Gujarat state non resident Gujaratis foundation, Gandhi nagar explained how govt has taken initiative to solve the NRI issues. He shared a booklet with students which had mobile numbers of key persons whom to contact when got cheated or for other queries. He emphasised on need of knowledge and awareness for being safe and not fell pray to many NRIs.
- Shri Dashrat Patel, Director NRG centre mehsana explained how NRG centre mehsana is leading in handling NRI marriages. Woman in foreign land can be may be denied maintenance on the ground that her marriage has been dissolved by a foreign court. She may also face various other legal impediments relating to the issues of private international law but she can seek help here in Gujarat.
- Dr. Asha Patel, MLA, Unja asked girl students to become self sufficient. Many institution and organizations are giving a number of training for competitive exams like GPSC, IAS etc but to boast confidence there is no institute. It should come from inside and advised the girls to become self sufficient, depend less on others and take their own decisions. Your decisions need to be robust and do not go for green gardens because life itself is not always beautiful garden. Particularly girls should remain prepared for everything good or worse. They should learn from life of Sita from Ramayana, being a wife of king, she has to face all challenges. Every lady should be well prepared.
- Shri A. K. Gupta, Principal judge family court Patan, aware us that parliamentary Standing Committee on External Affairs of India recently approved the Registration of Marriage of Non-Resident Indian Bill, 2019. The proposed Registration of Marriage of Non-Resident Indian Bill, 2019, has been designed to act as a legal weapon for Indian women who were married to NRI husbands, but were subsequently deserted. This law will certainly give power to support systems, such as government departments, which seek to protect women's rights.
- Shri Vishal B. Gadvi, Secretary , DLSA Patan explained the role of DLSA in handling NRI marriages. Asked the students to take legal training at DLSA free of cost so that they get legal knowledge which can be their weapon in hard times.

In this program, there were 480 participants. Amongst participants, there were graduate, postgraduate students, Ph. D students, teaching and non teaching faculty from university campus. The students were from dept law, chemistry, architecture, commerce, computer science, life science and physics, architecture etc.

3. Health awareness program for women



On August 13, 219 **Shostav day** was celebrated in Girls hostel of our university considering 13 august as health day as decided by schedule of fortnight program. There were 120 girl participants and speakers were Dr. Charuben Dhariya, Ayurvedic practionaer and govt doctor and Dr. Andrews Liggy, Head Biochemistry department of GMERS, Patan. Dr. Charu explained tips to girls, how a healthy minds lies in a healthy body. How internal energy can increase their mental power among students, so that retention can be increased. Dr. liggy explained some smaller tests to check our wellness. She emphasised on need on healthy brain sand mind. She emphasised on

has married girls using chatting etc. on facebook. And latter on discovered everything to be fraud. Many girls leave their houses and get involved in troubles. Students should be always careful and do not get emotional without knowing people in actual.

- **Mayuri Pandya, Director GLS, Ahemadabad,** It is prime need that students should be made aware of all digital crimes via many awareness programs and workshops. So that before using any gadget. Small decisions taken due to ignorance of can spoil the future of the student. Precaution and care is required in every aspect of life.
