Prof. Sangita Sharma, CASH chairperson, welcomed all the guests by words and explained the importance of the day.

Dr. Mohanbhai Patel, Gynaecologist, Navjivan hospital, Patan has explained that about five main types of gynecologic cancer are: cervical, ovarian, uterine, vaginal, and vulvar. A sixth type of gynecologic cancer is the very rare fallopian tube cancer. Of all the gynecologic cancers, only cervical cancer has screening tests that can find this cancer early, when treatment can be most effective compared to other types of cancer (like breast or colon cancer), gynecologic cancers are uncommon, all women are at risk for developing gynecologic cancers, and the risk increases with age.

Dr. Hiren solanki, MS gynocologist, GMERS, Patan explained vaginals cancers with powerpoint presentation He said general symptoms are Abnormal vaginal bleeding Unexplained weight loss, Vaginal discharge colored with blood Constant fatigue, Loss of appetite or feeling full all the time, Never hungry, Pain in the pelvis or abdominal area, Persistent indigestion or nausea, breast changes. Some of precaution is Pap test and an HPV test (co-testing) every five years, HPV test alone every five years, Pap test alone every three years

Dr. R. N. Desai, Registrar, HNGU, Patan narrated that Women her self is Generator of this society. She is empowered and is always empowered. Presidential Address was given by Prof. J. J. Vora, Honorable Vice Chancellor, Hemchandracharya North Gujarat University, Patan, he advised all to be careful because new cases of Covid has started emerging. So again women has to participate in this duty again..

A wife can file the following mental harassment cases against husband - cruelty under section 498A IPC, obscene language under section 294 IPC, outraged modesty under IPC section 354, section 509 of IPC insulting the modesty of such woman. For help of women, there are many laws, but successful implementation is possible with help of young people like students. He wanted that we all should join hands to curb this menace from the society and protect our daughters and sisters.




After awareness, a MCQ test was conducted in which all students who werepresent has participated.
